*Offer psychiatric evaluation of depression, anxiety, and ADHD concerns*



*Provide short-term medication management*



*Facilitate transition of care back to the student's primary care provider*

Parents, AEA staff, school administrators, or school mental health providers can refer students aged 10+ for child psychiatry services by completing the request for services form on our [website](#). Students 18+ in high school can self-refer.

Please note that the student must have a PCP (pediatrician or family medicine provider) to transfer care back to and a legal guardian willing to sign a release of information to the PCP.
