## How we support students



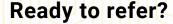
Offer psychiatric evaluation of depression, anxiety, and ADHD concerns



Provide short-term medication management



Facilitate transition of care back to the student's primary care provider





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Parents, AEA staff, school administrators, or school mental health providers can refer students aged 10+ for child psychiatry services by completing the request for services form on our <u>website</u>. Students 18+ in high school can self-refer.

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Please note that the student must have a PCP (pediatrician or family medicine provider) to transfer care back to and a legal guardian willing to sign a release of information to the PCP.

\*Scanlan Center for School Mental Health clinical services are fee-based. We accept medical insurance. Financial aid is available.
